Church attendance numbers are limited to 100. providing there is a four square metre space around each person, with the exception of people from the same household. So this means OLOL can have 100 but St Bernadette's can only have 65.

All parishes must ensure that their churches are not left unattended when their doors are open and they must keep written records with names and contact details of everyone who comes into the church at any time and these records must be kept for at least 4 weeks.

Note that collection plates are not allowed to be handled. So we have a leaving collection at the church door only. Also singing is not permitted and Parish Bulletins cannot be re-handled or re-used.

Miracle Music

One evening in 1741, a lonely man, feeling very old and useless shuffled along a London street in the dark. His name was George Fredric Handel. For 40 years he

had been a famous Court Musician, whose music was known to everyone. But then he had suffered a serious stroke, paralysing him so that he could not write music anymore. He was 60 years of age. As he walked past a church welling up from his soul came the cry "My God my God why have you forsaken me." When he arrived home he found a parcel on his desk. He unwrapped it. It was a bible and his eyes fell on the words, "He was despised and rejected by men." This struck a cord in Handel. At once he sat down and began to write. He worked almost non-stop for the next 24 days, taking little sleep or food. When the musical masterpiece 'THE MESSIAH' lay finished on his desk, he collapsed on his bed & slept for 17 hours. In his darkest hour he had achieved his greatest work.
